

JIMMY DENNIS, INNOCENT ON DEATH ROW

In 1991 Jimmy Dennis was a member of the award-winning amateur singing group “Sensation” in Philadelphia when he was falsely accused of shooting and killing a young woman named Chedell Williams for her \$125 pair of earrings. Ms. Williams was a complete stranger to Jimmy. The earrings and the murder weapon were never recovered. In fact, there isn’t any physical evidence linking Jimmy to this crime. The eyewitnesses described the assailant as being 5’9”, 5’10” or taller and weighing 170 to 190 pounds. Jimmy is 5’4” and weighed approximately 130 pounds at the time of the murder. In the picture below of the “Sensation” members, Jimmy is seated. On the right is a photo of Jimmy performing. In his closing arguments at the 1992 trial, even the prosecutor conceded that Jimmy didn’t have a motive to commit murder. It was established at trial that Jimmy was negotiating and about to sign a music contract at the time of his arrest.
